

Base station communication regulations

(1) Base station. A structure or equipment at a fixed location that enables Commission -licensed or authorized wireless communications between user equipment and a communications network.

In 1996, the FCC adopted updated guidelines for evaluating human exposure to RF fields from fixed transmitting antennas such as those used for cellular and PCS cell sites.

Base stations are sometimes called control or fixed stations in US Federal Communications Commission licensing. These terms are defined in regulations inside Part 90 of the commissions regulations.

§ 90.1331 Restrictions on the operation of base and fixed stations. (a) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (a) (2) of this section, base and fixed stations may not be located within 150 km of any ...
