Can radio and television broadcast be used as distance learning solutions?

The use of radio and television broadcasts as distance learning solutions is a powerful way to bridge the digital divide in the education sector and reach the most marginalised learners.

Do microlessons need quizzes?

Microlessons are designed for online self-learning; therefore, quizzes are often necessary for learning. Otherwise the students cannot judge whether or not they truly understand the lesson. Furthermore, the presentation skill needed substantial improvement.

Can radio and television provide distance education?

While radio and television can potentially provide distance education, there are major challenges in setting them up and using them for this purpose. One of the main challenges is the absence of pre-existing partnerships for the design and broadcasting of the educational content.

How do I make radio lessons a classroom?

Make radio lessons as much like a classroom as possible: e.g. ask 2-3 students to join each radio lesson and answer questions live, following safe distancing rules, and where local restrictions allow. Use text messages, calls, email or social media and video messaging using sign language, and answer live during recordings. NB.
