Adjective concentrated (comparative more concentrated, superlative most concentrated) Not dilute; having a high concentration.

A concentrated liquid has been increased in strength by having water removed from it. Sweeten dishes sparingly with honey, or concentrated apple or pear juice.

When you finally clean your bedroom, you'll have to pick up the clothes that are scattered everywhere so they're concentrated in the closet. Concentrated can also mean that something is very focused. ...

to (cause to) become more intense, as by removing or reducing the amount of liquid: [no object] The gravy thickened and concentrated in the microwave. [~ + object] Concentrate the gravy by boiling it.



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
