

Trolling definition

What does trolling mean?

Trolling is trying to get a rise out of someone. Forcing them to respond to you, either through wise-crackery, posting incorrect information, asking blatantly stupid questions, or other foolishness. However, trolling statements are never true or are ever meant to be construed as such.

What does troll mean?

: a lure or a line with its lure and hook used in trolling : a person who intentionally antagonizes others online by posting inflammatory, irrelevant, or offensive comments or other disruptive content Middle English trolle "to cause to move round and round" from Norwegian troll and Danish trolde, both meaning "a giant or dwarf of folklore";

What is trolling on-line forums?

Trolling on-line forums as described above is actually analogous to the fishing technique of "trolling", where colorful baits and lures are pulled behind a slow moving boat, often with multiple fishing lines, covering a large bodies of water, such as a large lake or the ocean.

Why do people troll?

The main elements of why people troll are interactions; trolling exists in the interactive communications between Internet users, influencing people's views both from objective and emotional standpoints. Further, trolling does not target a single individual, but rather targets multiple members of a discussion.
