What is a military department?

Each military department is established by law under Title 10 of the United States Code and operates under the authority, direction, and control of the SECDEF. Uniquely among the military departments, the Department of the Navy (DoN) comprises two distinct armed services: the United States Navy and the United States Marine Corps.

What is the primary mission of the Navy?

How does the Navy protect the United States?

The Department of the Navy protects the United States and its interests by the prosecution of war at sea, including the seizure or defense of advanced naval bases with the assistance of its Marine Corps component; supports the forces of all military departments of the United States; and safeguards freedom of the seas.

What does the Department of the Navy do?

The Department of the Navy includes the U.S. Coast Guard when it is operating as a Service in the Navy. The Secretary of the Navy is the head of the Department of the Navy, responsible for the policies and control of the Department of the Navy, including its organization, administration, functioning, and efficiency.
